In the last year and a half, whenever I have been asked about how Sunrise is doing financially with all the disruptions, I have used the analogy of *treading water* ~ *we're keeping our heads above the water*. During 2020, we were extremely fortunate to finish the year with a balanced budget. This year, we have continued our careful management of the church's finances; however, the reprieve in maintenance and repairs that we experienced last year did not hold for this year. In addition, the extended pause in our in-person activities is having its effect. With two months left in the year, we are hopeful that we can make up the Operating Budget deficit. Under normal times, this would not be a particular concern, but we are not certain what to expect for the close of 2021.

Why We Come to Church

Blest be the tie that binds our hearts in Christian love; the fellowship of kindred minds is like to that above.

Recently, I quoted this familiar hymn in one of my Devotional Prayers. It captures the essence of fellowship. It is hard to believe that March 8, 2020 was the last time we gathered in our Fellowship Hall for refreshments. Sunday, November 7, will be the first time in 20 months that we will be gathering in the Fellowship Hall to share refreshments!

This twenty-month pause has had a profound effect on us, individually and collectively. The bonds of Christian fellowship have been frayed. I sometimes fear that this weekly renewing of our Christian connection has been so disrupted that we are in danger of forgetting how important it is to us.

We come to church to be fed, body and soul. Worship renews our spirits as together we pray, sing, and embrace God's calling for our lives. As simple as it sounds, gathering in the Fellowship Hall and sharing food is an essential part of our faith! In *breaking bread* together, we nurture the deep roots of our care and compassion for one another.

This year, your Session has chosen to designate November as *Stewardship Emphasis Month*. Throughout the month, we will be receiving people's financial commitments for 2022. A mailing is going out on November 1st. It contains a pledge card and envelope for those wishing to make a financial pledge. You may either mail or bring it to the church. As always, our Finance Administrator, Bob Ingram is the only person that will open your pledge card envelope.

The *In-Person* life and activities of Sunrise are returning with energy and enthusiasm. The Men's Prayer Breakfast is meeting each Tuesday morning at 7:30 a.m. Adult Sunday school is once again being held in the church library. Both the Miriam-Naomi Circle and the Women's Evening Bible Study are again meeting in-person. Youth Group has weekly meetings in the Fellowship Hall. Our annual *Live Nativity* with its traditional animals is scheduled for December 11. There will be refreshments and crafts outside the Fellowship Hall. Our two Christmas Eve Services return to the sanctuary.

In this challenging season, your church leaders are confident that God's plan for us has and will continue to sustain our faith and community. We look forward to 2022, as we return more and more to in-person events and activities. Our hope and trust is secure in God's continued grace and love.

Friends, I look forward to seeing you very soon when we will once again be physically together in the Sanctuary and Fellowship Hall.

Sunday, 28 November - Let's begin Advent with Beethoven! This sonata no.7 has 4 movements and was composed during his "early period" in the year 1798. Compositions from the "early" period show the influence of Mozart and Haydn - for instance, this sonata has a rare 3rd movement "minuet" (Beethoven discarded the "minuet" which was a favorite of Mozart and Haydn - and developed instead a form called "scherzo"). Most importantly, this sonata has a tragic slow movement that is one of the greatest slow movements from Beethoven's entire output.
