How Long, O Lord?

This plea is repeated a number of times (fifteen by my count) in the psalms alone! Asking God, *how long* we must wait has deep Biblical roots, and the answer might surprise us. Instead of a direct response to a particular situation, the Biblical answer to *how long* focuses on how we choose to live our faith in the present.

We have entered the season of Advent. It is by definition a season of *waiting* and anticipation! At this time each year, we are reminded that waiting is a faith-practice. Yet, this year feels different. I looked back at my December 2020 article and recognized the newness of celebrating Christmas in the midst of a pandemic. It is now a year later, and we are still dealing with the implications of the pandemic.

The weight of waiting can be very heavy. The physical distancing that began so suddenly in March 2020, and changed everything we knew about church, has been much slower in returning to what is familiar around Sunrise. Fellowship and in-person events have resumed, but people are understandably cautious. Looking to the Biblical witness, I believe we are experiencing the beginning of a new chapter for our faith-lives.

The transformation we are experiencing is hard. Not being easily able to be with each other in-persons hurts our strong sense of community and belonging. It creates a distance that we have to find new ways of overcoming. The Bible teaches us that when our faith is challenged there are lessons to be learned. What we learn and then what we do becomes our witness to God's faithfulness in uncertain times.

I am not at all certain what the celebration of Christmas and the remainder of this year will look like. The challenges are steep. What was initially a sense of this being a brief, pandemic pause no longer looks to be brief or simply a pause. The life of the church has changed in ways we are only beginning to realize.

I do believe that the good news of the coming of Christ into the world is the hope for the world. When times look bleak, God provides. Think about how the birth of Jesus has transformed the world! The Apostle Paul preached the *Good News* that there is nothing that can ever separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus.

Please look carefully through this issue of *The Beacon*. There is an emphasis on the timeless celebrations of Christmas. Rather than focusing on the things we are not able to do this year, let's make those things we can do really matter! Each Sunday, there is special music. This is why we consolidated the Early Service with the 11:00 a.m. Worship Service during the Christmas season. The *Live Nativity* is on Saturday, December 11th! It is our annual gift to the community and a wonderful event! The Christmas Eve Services will again be in the sanctuary this year.

I look forward to seeing you for as many of these events as you are comfortable attending.







Calling All Volunteers


