## Amazing Grace

This year is the 250th Anniversary of the writing of the hymn *Amazing Grace*. If you are not familiar with the story behind the author of this beloved hymn, it is quite a remarkable witness to God's amazing grace in our lives. The Lenten devotionals we are using this year are based on the hymn. They have inspired the sermon series that Reece and I are preaching during Lent.

John Newton is the author of the words of *Amazing Grace*. He wrote the hymn for a sermon preached on New Year's Day 1773. The powerful imagery of God's amazing grace is drawn from his own life experience. John Newton grew up at sea, serving on ships from the young age of seven. His early life was very rough, and he grew into an extremely irreverent man. When he weathered the storm that began his conversion to faith, he was serving on a slave ship. By some accounts, he was the captain. Eventually, he studied to become an Anglican priest. The epitaph he wrote for his gravestone is an honest appraisal of his life:

John Newton, clerk, once an infidel and libertine, a servant of slaves in Africa, was by the rich mercy of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, preserved, restored, pardoned, and appointed to preach the faith he had long labored to destroy.

The theme of *grace* is a guiding principle of Presbyterianism. It defines our relationship with God. It is by God's grace that we have received the gift of faith.

The opening verse of the hymn captures the essence of God's love and care for us:

Amazing grace, how sweet the sound, That saved a wretch like me! I once was lost, but now I'm found, Was blind but now I see.

John Newton experienced the patient, ever-present love of God that is continually waiting for us. We are the ones that keep holding back. Closing our hearts to God's constant reaching out to us.

The journey through Lent is a spiritual pilgrimage. It is a time that we remind ourselves to be intentional about making room for God. I frequently find myself describing this journey as an emptying of our selves in order to make room for God. The process involves honesty and humility. We need to be honest about the ways we turn away from God or hold God at a distance. This honesty requires humility.


In the Affirmation of Faith drawn from Philippians that we are reciting during Lent, we are affirming the humility that Jesus, himself, adopted:

Christ Jesus though he was in the form of God, did not count equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient unto death— even death on a Cross.

Jesus bears witness to what a deep, trusting relationship with God looks like. As we make the journey once again to Jerusalem and Holy Week, I pray that each of us experiences the love that claims, redeems us, and brings us into the loving embrace of God.
