#### **Connections**

Recently, I have been exploring what an author of an article I read has called the three **B**'s of the church: **belief**, **behavior**, **and belonging**. The article addressed the present situation for so many congregations, declining attendance at weekly worship services. From national surveys, the article compared what people say they believe with their practicing of religion. While people have become less likely to attend worship weekly, there has not been a significant decline in people's belief in God. I would like to review some of the imagery I have shared as a way of highlighting the *connections* that make church life so vital.

There is an adage about the spread of Christianity from the time of the apostles to medieval Europe. Christianity began in Jerusalem as a *fellowship*. When it moved into the Greek-speaking world, it became a *philosophy*. When it arrived in Rome, it was an *institution*. In Europe, where it was known as Christendom; it was the *culture*. Each of these transitions contribute something to our understanding about the present situation in the church

At its origins, Christianity was a *fellowship*. It was built on relationships and shared experiences. Jesus demonstrated this by calling the disciples as the first act of his earthly ministry. Jesus modeled for us how fellowship is an essential part of following him.

As Christianity developed it sought to put into words what the faithful believed. The church came to call the ways we describe our beliefs orthodoxy (right belief). To affirm something outside of these *right beliefs* was considered a heresy! Teaching the faith meant instructing people in the right beliefs.

Once Christianity was embraced as the religion of the Roman Empire, it had institutional responsibilities, and the practice of faith became significant. How and where you worshipped mattered.

Finally, as Christianity became the religion of medieval Europe, and it shaped the whole culture. By birth, everyone was a Christian. Art, music, literature were all connected to the church.

While this overview is simplistic, I believe it contains insights into the journey of the church. From it we can glean assumptions that have guided us in the past. Reflecting on these assumptions may allow us to *reclaim* parts of our heritage that we may have taken for granted.

There was a time not that long ago when belonging to a community could be taken for granted. In those circumstances, teaching the faith and practicing the ritual of weekly worship attendance was an important emphasis. Today, community cannot be assumed as a given. The bonds that once held us together have weakened. Our lives lead us in so many different directions. Building meaningful community bonds has become a real challenge.

I like to think of community bonds as *connections*. At Sunrise, we have three local connections. There are the personal friendships that grow from being part of the congregation. I have seen these friendships develop, flourish, and nurture people. There are the church connections that allow us to do more together than we could ever do individually. Being part of something larger than oneself is an inspiring experience. Finally, there are our community connections that extend beyond the congregation. We open our doors to our local community. We are the polling site for Sullivan's Island. We host the Seaside Singers and recently enjoyed a wonderful concert. We host Blood Drives. There is a long list of groups and activities that are part of the Sunrise *Community*. These connections are a vital part of both our church life and witness.






## Growing FAITH
