Sunrise has been a member of the Hands of Christ's Presbytery-wide project since 2004, which has now grown to over 22 local area congregations. Our common goal is to provide school uniforms and basic school supplies to needy students. In keeping with the Presbyterian Reformed tradition, we believe that education is the key to the success of individuals and communities. The program seeks to assist children in economic need as they begin the new school year with some of the necessary tools for success. While we are faith-based, we serve children in need regardless of their faith background. Last year was our 20th distribution season, having served 1,944 children, totaling 65,342 children since 2003.

Joy-filled Living

Memorial Day Weekend marks the beginning of summer. Schedules change into summer mode. For school-age children, this means summer break and a couple of months of fun-filled vacation days without the demands of school. For parents, it's juggling these changed schedules, which at times can be stressful! Discovering the *joyful* possibilities of the summer season is an opportunity for us all to embrace *joy-filled living*.

Joy-filled living is a way of life. This may sound obvious (or redundant!), but it means approaching each day as a series of opportunities filled with joy! Anticipation is an integral part of it. If we choose to focus on what is wrong we will surely find it. If we choose to imagine what could be, we will be inspired!

In his bestselling book, *Stumbling on Happiness*, Daniel Gilbert defines humanity's greatest achievement not in terms of what we have built, but as our capacity for *conscious experience*. *Seeing, remembering,* and *imagining* are all part of conscious experience; however, Gilbert believes that imagining is the key to our joyful future.

To see is to experience the world as it is, to remember is to experience the world as it was, but to imagine – ah, to imagine is to experience the world, not as it presently is, nor as it has always been, but as it might be. Gilbert calls this the joy of the next.

The joy of the next involves hopeful anticipation. These days, it is far too easy to look ahead with a sense of dread. Gilbert invites us to make the conscious choice of anticipating the best rather than the worst. Each of us can choose to be inspired by hope-filled possibilities.

In the busyness of our daily lives, it is so easy to get caught up in all of the practical details ~ what we often call *making it through the day!* There are tasks to accomplish, schedules to keep, and deadlines – always deadlines. When we allow the practical to overshadow the potential, we loose sight of *what is not but can be*.

To imagine life as God intends it to be is truly a joyful and joy-filled experience! It calls us beyond the world, as we know it, as well as transcending the world as it has been, by inviting us to *imagine* the world as it could be. In this way, God makes us partners in both transforming the world and our lives.

There is a church in our Presbytery that has become well known for a phrase that serves as a commissioning: *Cause God Joy!* The phrase is printed in the bulletin and, most memorably, it on the backside of all the church signs. So, as you leave the church grounds you are reminded to: *Cause God Joy!*

Heading into this summer, may we see beyond the immediate demands of our hectic lives and feel that deep joy of living and loving.


There are fewer distribution sites this year. We're encouring our volunteers to get together and sign up to go as a team. There will be signups posted at the church and online at the beginning of July.

Cameron McCullough is graduating from Bishop England High School and will head to the University of Denver in Colorado in the fall.




Reece Campbell is graduating from Wando this year and will be attending Salem College on a volleyball scholarship.






Women's Evening Bible Study
