A lot is Going On Around Sunrise!

You have been hearing about the hybrid homeschooling program, Veritas that will be using our classrooms on Mondays and Thursdays during the school year. Last week, Veritas had the downstairs hallway, first floor classrooms, and a number of the upstairs classrooms painted. They look wonderful!

As a reminder, here is some information on Veritas:

Veritas Classical Schools is a program that uses church space to offer homeschooling families a unique complement to their home study programs with an emphasis on a classical Christian model of education. Veritas functions in the role of tutor, assisting parents in their educational roles. Each student attends Veritas one day per week during the school year according to the child's age group with the option for elective classes on a second day.

The purpose of Veritas Classical Schools is to help mold students into thinkers, young men and women who do not simply "regurgitate" the information they have been fed but rather who analyze, critique, and affect the world by applying Biblical wisdom to their lives, families, and communities. The Veritas student is taught to be a lifelong learner, to consistently evaluate and critique relevant issues, and to always seek to skillfully communicate their thoughts. All students at Veritas Schools learn factual and philosophical truth, learn to evaluate the messages they are receiving from the world around them, and learn to defend their beliefs in a persuasive manner.

The Sunrise Children's School signs will be removed during August. This is a safety matter that all churches have to do now. Sadly, we live in a time when we do not want to advertise that there are children present for school!

Search for a New Youth Director

The Session voted to develop a position description for a youth director to begin leading our Middle School young people. Parents, Reece Humphreys, Jimmy Heirs, Caroline Faltynski, and I will meet to develop the position description for the Session. A search committee will then begin advertising and interviewing for the position.

Caroline Faltynski has volunteered to support our regularly attending Senior Highs in a mentoring role.

Elder Nominating

The Elder Nominating Committee will begin meeting in August and are requesting suggestions from the congregation. There will be forms in the narthex that list the members of the Elder Nominating Committee, as well as the Elder positions.

Return of our Ritual of Friendship

Since March of 2020, we have hesitated to resume one of our favorite worship activities, *The Ritual of Friendship*. On Sunday, July 23, the moment arrived in the sermon. Reflecting on the epidemic of loneliness and the power of connecting person-to-person, I invited people to take three minutes to get up and greet one another. At the 11:00 a.m. service, I wasn't sure if I would be allowed to continue my sermon. *The Ritual of Friendship* is once again part of Sunday mornings at Sunrise. We are mindful of those that need to keep a distance for health reasons; however, we are warmly greeting each other at the beginning of each worship service.




