

Litany of Penitence

Leader: In this sacred season, let us prepare our hearts to receive God's forgiveness and grace.

Unison: Holy and merciful God, we confess to you and to one another, and to the whole communion of the faithful in heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word, and action, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

Leader: We have not loved you with our whole heart, mind, and strength. We have not loved our neighbors as ourselves. We have not forgiven others as we have been forgiven.

People : Have mercy on us, God.

Leader: We have not listened to your call to serve as Christ served us. We have not been true to the mind of Christ. We have grieved your Holy Spirit.

People: Have mercy on us, God.

Leader: We confess to you, God, all our past unfaithfulness: the pride, hypocrisy, and impatience in our lives.

People: We confess to you, God.

Leader: Our self-indulgent appetites and ways, and our exploitation of other people.

People: We confess to you, God.
