Lent Begins . . . Wednesday, February 14th

Throughout my ministry, I have promoted the special nature of Lent as a time of sacred preparation for the celebration of Easter morning. It is a time of personal reflection and community fellowship. Ash Wednesday is the beginning of Lent, and it is a service that is both deeply personal and profoundly communal. In the receiving of ashes we humble ourselves before God, and we join together in supporting each other in a journey of renewal.

As part of the annual, personal journey towards Jerusalem and Holy Week, many people choose to prepare themselves by *giving up something* for Lent. Over the years, I've tracked the top contenders. Chocolate seems to be a perennial list topper for things to give up during Lent. To chocolate can be added other favorite foods or drinks. Coffee, alcohol, or soda tends to be near the top of the list. More recently, social media has been added. People will choose to limit or eliminate Facebook, Twitter [X], or other social media sites.

Lent becomes a season of reorientation, turning from things that really do not matter or are holding us back. It is a time to focus on the *goodness* of God's creation. Yes, in spite of all the bad news in the world, there is much that is good, when we open our eyes to see it. First, there is the gift of our lives, which means we are a gift in the lives of the people around us. Do we take that *good* news seriously enough? The world itself is an incredible gift that, too often, we take for granted. Appreciating the wonder of God's creation is something we can practice each and every day. Recently, the sunrises have been glorious! If you are not an early riser, the sunsets have been equally amazing. Focusing on the goodness all around us will help to reorient our perspective, which is the purpose of Lent.

While Lent has been traditionally seen as a season of denial, it can also be a time for picking up good habits. When we give up something for Lent we are shedding an old habit in order to embrace better habits. The purpose of denial in giving up a *bad* habit is so that it might be replaced with a *good* one. What good habits would you like to adopt? Lent is a great time for doing it. In fact, we could even announce to our friends and family our intentions. Some accountability is a really helpful motivation.

This year consider adopting a new, good habit, and be intentional about practicing it. Instead of setting such a high, challenging bar that you spend much of your time anticipating the end of Lent, pick a small step that you can easily manage. If your goal is eating healthier, pick a fruit or vegetable you like and add it to your daily diet. If it's exercising more, park your car on the far side of the parking lot and walk to your destination. A bonus is that there are usually more parking spaces there!

I invite you to mark your calendar and plan to attend our Ash Wednesday Service. It is a profoundly beautifully service with deep roots in how to fully live our faith.




