SERVICE OF SHADOWS

7:30 p.m. March 29, 2024

This service is an adaptation of an early fourth-century worship service, traditional to Holy Week. The church is well lighted at the beginning of the service. The lights dim as it continues, until, at the end, the sanctuary is shrouded in deep shadows. The gradual extinguishing of the lights and candles is symbolic of the flight of the disciples and the resentment of the world leading to the final isolation of Jesus on the Cross. At the conclusion a bell is tolled thirty-three times, recalling each year of Christ's life.

Grant us this night a true vision of all that he suffered, in his betrayal, his lonely agony, his false trial, his mocking and scourging, and the torture of death upon the cross. As you have given yourself utterly for us, may we give ourselves entirely to you. Amen.

Holy God, before you all hearts are open, and from you no secrets are hid. We bring you now our shame and sorrow for our sins. We have forgotten that life is from you and unto you. We have neither sought nor done your will. We have not been truthful in our hearts, in our speech, and in our lives. We have not loved as we ought to love. Help us and heal us, we pray. Raise us from our sins to a better life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Marche funèbre from the Piano Sonata No. 2 in Bb minor, Op. 35 by Frédéric Chopin

The opening strains of this piece will sound very familiar. Oftentimes this sonata is called the *Funeral March Sonata* due to its famous and mournful third movement. From the time of its publication in 1840, Chopin's second sonata was both inspirational and controversial. Robert Schumann criticized Chopin for even calling the work a *sonata* due to its lack of cohesiveness. He referred to the four movements as *four of his maddest children under the same roof*. Rachmaninoff, though, praised this sonata and used it as a model for his own works. This sonata is a force to be reckoned with. Over the years, all of the famous pianists have performed and record it. ~ *Matthew*
