Hope for the World: Past, Present, and Future

On Easter morning, I preached a message of *hope*. In our turbulent world, hope appears to be in short supply. Messages of despair dominate the news and social media. My message was about finding *hope* in our troubled world.

The past is a witness to God's goodness at work in the most challenging of situations. The Apostle Paul knew all too well the risks and dangers of his mission. In his letter to the Church in Rome, he distilled the essence of his faith and hope in God.

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ²through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. ³And not only that, but we also boast in our **sufferings**, knowing that suffering produces **endurance**, ⁴and endurance produces **character**, and character produces **hope**, ⁵and **hope does not disappoint us**, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. (Romans 5:1-5)

Recently, I heard a phrase that inspired me and applies to all of us as Christians. It was shared by two-time NBA champion and former U.S. Senator, Bill Bradley. When asked how he kept a positive attitude when he was facing the challenges of serving in the U.S. Senate with all the negativity around him, he simply replied: *You see, I'm in the optimism business!* He went on to describe his upbringing in Crystal City, Missouri, and how he had been raised to embrace all of life's possibilities. By any measure, his life has been remarkable.

Looking to the long history of our *resurrection faith*, I can say with full confidence that God is at work all around us, especially in the most challenging of times. To borrow Bill Bradley's statement, as Christians: *WE are in the Optimism Business!*

There is a picture of a half-filled glass of water on the cover of Gregg Easterbrook's book, *The Progress Paradox: How Life Gets Better While People Feel Worse.* The theme of the book is well described in its title. Our contemporary crisis can be characterized by how we choose to describe half-a-glass of water. Is it *half full* or is it *half empty?* Believing there IS hope is the dilemma facing us. Recognizing that our challenges are, sadly, nothing new in human history offers us the possibility of embracing hope.

In the prayer attributed to St. Francis of Assisi, we are provided guidance in how hope can push back against despair:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace. Where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; and where there is sadness, joy.

As we look to the future, our hope rests where it always should, trusting God's love in Christ Jesus that spans the generations. It is the witness of all the faithful that has come down to us from past generations that sustains us today. It is that witness that inspires us to be hopeful for future generations.

On Easter Sunday, those generations were represented in our sanctuary. I baptized an infant, whose mother had been baptized as an infant on an Easter morning. Sitting in the pews was a woman about to celebrate her 101st birthday. The joy shared across the generations was truly inspiring. We are in the optimism business!

Our Cub Scouts participated in the annual Pinewood Derby Race in the Fellowship Hall on Saturday March 23rd. The Fellowship Hall was as noisy as a NASCAR race, but not from the cars. Each Cub Scout received a kit containing a block of pinewood, two axles and four wheels. With this kit the Cubs carve, paint and decorate their race cars.

Our track has 4 lanes with the race cars being released at the start line at the same time and electronic speed measurement at the end of the track. There were multiple runs to determine the winners. Winners received trophies for 1st , 2nd , and 3rd place finishes based on speed, as well as prizes for the best design and for the sibling race series winners. Winners from our Pack 59 move on to the Cub Scout District Pinewood Derby on April 13th to compete against Cub Scouts from other Packs.
