There's a word we use a lot in the family service: IMAGINE. It usually sounds something like this: "Imagine you've been outside listening to Jesus talking; you're hungry and it doesn't look like there's enough food for everyone." Sometimes it sounds like this: "Imagine your parents take you out of town on a trip. They are on the way back home and realize you're not in the car." Anyone can hear a biblical story and think about what it may have looked like 2,000 years ago, but what if it happened to you...what if it happened today? It's amazing how our ideas change when we find *ourselves* in the middle of a story and not some random stranger.

Recently we've asked the children to imagine being born and growing up in a country they love...then one day their family decides they have to leave that country and move somewhere else to be safe. And what if they get to that new place and don't have even the basic necessities. Or what if there's a bad storm or an earthquake and their home is destroyed? Try to imagine what you would need. For many of the children who attend the family service this is an easy question to answer. It's easy because many of them have already participated in the World Church Service hygiene kit program. In 2019 and 2022 the congregation generously donated items that were packed by the children into kits that were later used by storm victims and refugees. These kits were used by adults and children alike during times they likely never excepted. Both refugees and storm survivors who find themselves without the most basic necessities are undoubtedly relieved to be given a bag containing soap, a toothbrush, and a washcloth.

It's time for us to help replenish the supply and be there for people when they need it most. That's where you come in! The children will be packing hygiene kits Sunday, May 19 at 10am. In 2022 we packed 101 kits. Let's beat that number this year! This is what we need from you. Starting this Sunday there will be a bin in the Narthex for the items listed below. Please help us fill and refill that bin over the next four Sundays. Each week between now and May 12 I'll give you an update of what we've collected and what we still need.

ITEMS NEEDED (Please excuse the specificity, but we can only use certain items in the kits.)

Washcloths

Hand towels

Wide-tooth combs (not the fine-tooth pocket combs)

Nail clippers (either fingernail or toenail)

Bath soap (regular size, individually wrapped)

Toothbrushes (individually boxed or wrapped)

Band-Aids (standard sized)

Other items cannot be accepted for this project. A tube of extended expiration date toothpaste will be added to each hygiene kit prior to reaching its recipient.


